## PROPOSALS SPONSORED BY REP. SUMMERS, HOUSE DISTRICT 22

### 2011 Legislative Session, Jan. 12 — May 11, 2011

- ◆ HB 1003 – Would have required voters to present a government-issued form of identification with a photograph to vote. *Defeated in the Senate State Affairs Committee.*
- ◆ HB 1016 – Prohibits minors from using or possessing E-cigarettes. *Signed by the governor.*
- ◆ HB 1102 – Allows an employee at a licensed child care facility who has obtained a proper background check to bypass a second duplicative background check if the employee is transferred to another licensed child care facility owned by the same parent entity. *Signed by the governor.*
- ◆ SB 40 – Requires youth activity coaches to complete an annual concussion recognition course. *Signed by the governor.*
- ◆ SB 123 – Updates state law concerning child support in the State of Colorado. *Signed by the governor.*
- ◆ SB 128 – Requires health insurance carriers that participate in the individual health insurance market in Colorado to offer child-only health benefit plans. *Signed by the governor.*
- ◆ SB 250 – Saves money for the state by increasing Medicaid eligibility for pregnant women to shift more pregnant women away from the Children's Basic Health Plan to Medicaid, saving taxpayer dollars. *Signed by the governor.*
